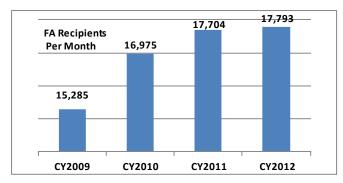


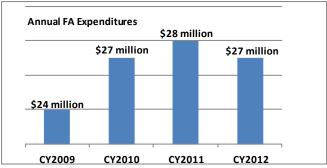

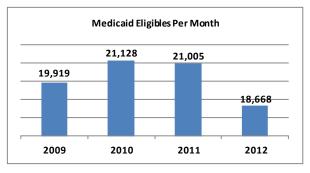
## OWF/Cash Assistance

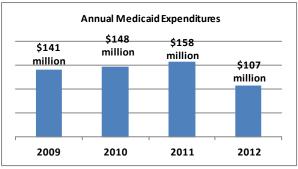


75% OF ASSIGNED HOURS WERE COMPLETED BY OWF PARTICIPANTS.

THE AGENCY MET THE ALL-FAMILY RATE OF 50% EVERY MONTH.

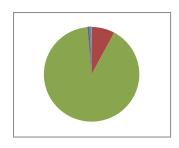

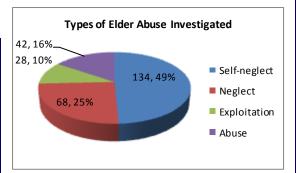

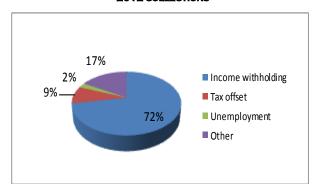
